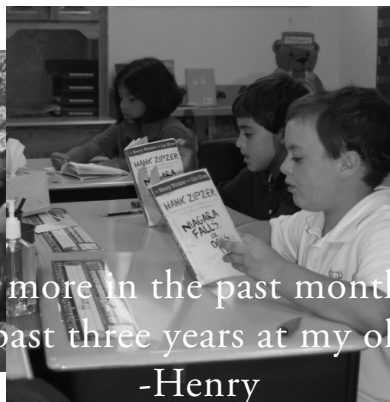

March of 1977, Sandhills Academy was recognized as a 501(c)3 and expanded from a

Saturday school to a full-time school. In the fall of 2004, the Board of Trustees voted

to change the name to Sandhills School, serving students in the first through eighth

grades.

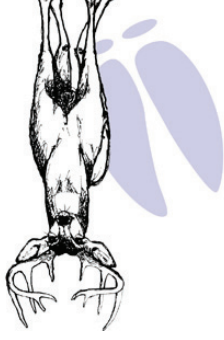
