Sandhills School is an independent, non-profit school that gives bright students the tools needed to succeed and become leaders among their peers and in the community. At Sandhills, highly specialized teachers focus on the strengths of each student and help to navigate traditional obstacles of learning. We provide a supportive, college preparatory environment where the first through twelfth graders rediscover the joy of learning and renew their intellectual curiosity. Through academic success in small, hands on classes, leadership opportunities on the sports field and the stage, traveling internationally and serving the community, our students gain confidence in their abilities, and fears and anxieties begin to fade. Sandhills' parents notice a positive difference in their child almost immediately.

For more than forty years, Sandhills School has changed the lives of young people diagnosed with language-based learning differences such as dyslexia or ADHD. As the only Orton-Gillingham accredited college preparatory school in the Midlands, Sandhills teachers are highly trained to provide research-based individualized instruction tailored to each student's academic needs.

Our graduates go on to colleges of their choice, are recognized by state and national scholarships, and are equipped with the tools they need to succeed in college and beyond.

Our Need

At Sandhills School we believe in educating the whole child, body, and mind. But our ability to achieve these goals is limited in our existing facilities. Sandhills School finds itself at a crossroads.

We are excited about expanding enrollment and the ability to serve more students. However, our facilities are being stretched beyond their limits.

The growth of Sandhills School, as evidenced by waiting lists in several classes, and the rapid expansion of our high school, has made our current facilities inadequate to meet demand. Common areas in the school, such as the library and cafeteria frequently double as spaces for performances, student gatherings, physical education, after school activities, and much more.

Currently our athletic teams are without a home-court and are shuttled to off-campus facilities for competitions. Our performing arts programs are growing by leaps and need additional space. Expanding our facilities is needed in order to provide the holistic school experience that attracts and retains students most in need of the specialized education we offer.
